Roser Park, St. Petersburg, FL



Well, the calender has rolled over into 2017 and I hope all the Walk 'n Mass gang enjoyed a pleasant winter holiday season. I've been hiding out in Florida since Halloween but most of that time a nasty flu bug had laid me low. There **are** germs, even in paradise.

With the start of the VolksSouth season of 15 Wednesday walks coordinated with local AVA clubs in the greater Tampa Bay area, I felt strong enough to assay ten kilometers. I survived. And enjoyed a pleasant lunch with the group at the Hanger restaurant in St. Pete's Whitten Airport. This small general aviation facility claims to be the start of the first commercial (i.e. paid) airplane flight in America. On New Year's Day 1914 the mayor of St. Petersburg paid some \$400 for a 30-minute hop across Tampa Bay to a business meeting in Tampa. Just him and the pilot; not exactly like today.

Whitten Airport sits across the street from the (Salvador) Dali Museum, well worth a visit any time. This month it hosts a traveling exhibit on early twentieth century artist Frida Kahlo (aka Mrs. Diego

Rivera) that Pauline very much wanted to see. In a pleasant garden rest area on the museum grounds sits a large banyan tree to which the museum has attached

Next to the Dali stands the Mahaffey
Theater, mostly a music venue, where we
plan to watch the Shen Yun dancers in a
few weeks. Further up the bayfront

place in this city over the past couple of
decades.

Much of the walk passes through residential and academic neighborhoods, pleasant but neither scenic nor historic. I'll just close with a view of the sunrise over Tampa Bay. In a few weeks, we'll visit the northern part of St. Petersburg.

Save the Date – Saturday, March 25. While the annual club Soup Walk will again take place in Hopkinton, we have a **new** start point, St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Wood Street (Rt. 135), enabling POC Bev Lange to show us some parts of her childhood hometown that we haven't walked previously. The 10km route includes new neighborhoods and Water Fresh Farm Marketplace, where vegetables are grown hydroponically, and they also have an ice cream silo!

Year-round Events – Six events opened in January: three in Boston (Freedom Trail, Back Bay and Boston & Beyond), Lowell, Newton, and Sandwich. You may walk these routes whenever it fits your schedule: ask for the Walk Box at the start; fill out the Registration Log, take a Start Card and written directions, and stamp your books and leave the completed envelope when done. Group walks of these events are also scheduled, which gives you an opportunity to walk with others. In case of inclement/unsafe snow/ice conditions, check with the POC if a scheduled group walk will take place. Contact info can be found on the club website and on www.ava.org.
