Trail Master's Diary: Holliston

There's no question that the year 2020 has been a challenging one for the Walk 'n Mass Volkssport Club along with everyone else. Several of our Year Round Events closed down in mid-March. Some of our Seasonal Events were not able to open on April 1. There still aren't definitive dates as to when we can access some Start Points. We were unable to hold traditional events this spring due to the pandemic, and are trying to re-schedule them. There is some good news, however. Walk 'n Mass invites you to walk a 5km or 10km route in Holliston on August 22. Some adjustments had to be made to the original plan. The Start Point needed to be changed, and our traditional picnic that was scheduled will not be held. However, there are picnic tables and plenty of room to bring your own chairs and food and catch up with your fellow walkers at a safe distance. After all, it's been a while since we've been together.

The first 5km loop passes by Our Lady of Fatima Shrine Church and the Xaverian Missionaries' Office/Residence Building on the way to the Upper Charles Rail Trail. The trail, built on a rail bed, will eventually reach approximately 24 miles, connecting the towns of Sherborn, Holliston, Milford, Hopkinton, and Ashland. The Holliston portion is 6.7 miles, stretching from Milford to Sherborn. It's a great place to walk on a summer day, since the trees provide plenty of shade. You never know what wildlife you might spot on this out and back route, so keep your eyes open. The route then returns to the shrine for the 5km finish and 10km checkpoint.

The second loop on the 10km route takes walkers around the Rosary Walk on the grounds of Our Lady of Fatima Shrine. The rosary is 950 feet long with an anchor donated by the US Navy. Boulders that were excavated during the building of Route 495 serve as rosary beads. Look at the plaques on the boulders. They have the Hail Mary written in different languages in alphabetical order. I like to look at them and try to figure out which

language will come next. Whenever I think I

know, I always seem to forget one. The route then crosses Summer Street, passing Mission Spring Housing, before heading into Wenakeening Woods. The woods are a public access area gifted to the Upper Charles Conservation Inc. by the Avery-Dennison Corporation, and cover 100 acres. There's a network of trails, and our loop takes walkers along several of them. The natural trails are great for

of them. The natural trails are great for hiking. The route then joins the Upper Charles Rail Trail before heading back to the finish.

The two loops are relatively flat. The 5km loop is on paved and packed stone dust trails. It has an AVA rating of 1B, doable for baby strollers, but difficult for wheelchairs. The 10km route also includes natural trails, with tree roots and rocks underfoot, along with some paved and packed stone dust surfaces. It has an AVA rating of 1C, not suitable for wheelchairs or strollers.

I know I'm excited about finally having a traditional event this year. Join Walk 'n Mass on August 22 for 5km and 10km routes in Holliston, and catch up with your fellow walkers. Of course, all current health rules apply. Hope to see you on the trail!

Walk Coordinator Speaks

Holliston, MA – August 22 – We look forward to seeing YOU at our first walk event of this unusual year. Our processes will be modified to comply with COVID-19 guidelines to help keep all of us safe while getting back to a semblance of "normalcy."

We ask that you wear a face covering, especially when not able to keep 6-foot distance from other people. Please bring your own pen to use for registering and bring your own water. To keep touchpoints to a minimum, we will not use our yellow water coolers. We will have bottled water available if you need to replenish your supply, and we'll also have sanitizer and sanitizing wipes on hand for regular cleaning of surfaces and common touchpoints. We are currently refining other processes to ensure safety for all.

There is PLENTY of OUTDOOR SPACE at our grassy outdoor Start/Finish next to the large Fatima Shrine parking lot. We invite you to bring your own lunch and a chair so you can safely socially distance while eating and enjoying in-person conversations with fellow walkers. The current group maximum in outdoor spaces is 100 people. Since our recent total walk participation number has ranged from 30 to 75, we should have no problem remaining in compliance.

for a 2-hour shift. Staffing needs: Trail Marking (one 2-person team for each of the two 5km loops), Start, Finish, Checkpoint, Specialties, Trail Take-down (one 2-person team for each of the two 5km loops).

Tiverton, RI – October 17 -- The Tiverton event originally scheduled in April 2020 has been rescheduled for **Saturday, October 17, 2020**. We will, however, do things a bit differently to comply with COVID-19 guidelines and regulations. Rather than set up inside the restaurant that is our start point, we will set up outside. We'll also employ the same sanitizing practices as established at our August 22 event.

Attleboro, MA – December 5 – At this time, we anticipate that the walk starting at La Salette Shrine will take place on **Saturday**, Dec. 5, 2020. We have received the go-ahead from La Salette and the Industrial Museum (the start for the 5km route); still waiting to hear from Capron Park Zoo regarding setting up the checkpoint there and access to the zoo for our walkers. Stay tuned!

Devens, MA – As this newsletter goes to press, we are still waiting to hear back from our museum start point regarding their availability for **Nov. 21, 2020**. If this does not happen, we will reschedule that event in 2021.
