Walk Coordinator Speaks

Devens, MA—Walkers who came to the event in November 2020 and many club members who couldn't make it last fall, asked us to visit Devens again. So, on May 15 (Armed Forces Day) we're returning to Devens, MA. The walk starts at Fort Devens Museum, 94 Jackson Road. Please plan some extra time to explore the museum, which houses items from World War I through Vietnam. The 5K and 11K routes are totally separate, so if you want to walk a longer distance, here's your opportunity. If you'd like to help staff this event, please contact me. We will continue to comply with pandemic safety protocols; face coverings are required.

Boston-Special Places—Carol Giesecke and Marianne Marshall are resurrecting the route last offered in 2013. The route explores some of Boston's lesser known gems that are not seen on either the Boston Freedom Trail or Back Bay Year Round Events. We'll do it as a map-guided day event with a 2-hour start window and a designated time for those who want to walk in a group. Stay tuned for the date and details.
