






Plank location sketch (https://www.sandwichmass.org/299/The-Boardwalk)

Sandwich, MA Boardwalk

In June 2002, the Walk 'n Mass leadership team approved the expenditure of \$150 for a commemorative plank reading WALK'N MASS VOLKSSPORT (22 letters) on the Sandwich boardwalk, which forms part of our seasonal walk route.

Funds raised through the sale of planks helped to pay for maintenance of the 1,500-ft timber boardwalk that was first constructed in 1875 over the saltwater marsh and Mill Creek. Repaired frequently over the years, it was fully reconstructed in 1992 after severe damage by Hurricane Bob. Supporters rebuilt it with the sale of over 1700 planks that were personalized with engraved messages.

Over time, the sand wears out engravings (compare photos of our plank from 2012 and 2021), planks break, and the receding dune continues to shorten the boardwalk. The last repair to a section of the structure was made in 2020, and it was determined that the lumber and fasteners were severely decayed

and corroded. Plans were then begun to completely rebuild the boardwalk in 2023. Permitting and flood zone rules now require a higher elevation, slope adjustment and railings to meet accessibility standards.

During the blizzard on January 29, 2022, a 200-ft section of the boardwalk between the end of the bridge over Mill Creek and Turnout #2 lifted up and broke away. From TV coverage of the damaged section, I am certain that our plank was not a part of that section. Our plank is located in Section E (between Turnout #3 and the beach). Because the new boardwalk will be wider, repurposing current planks is not in the plans.

While the boardwalk is out of commission, POC Pat Damiani has rerouted the walk route to avoid that area. Pat will alert us if/when a new call goes out for commemorative planks, so we can continue to show our support for this structure.

Participation Review

You might be interested to learn that our club pays annual sanction fees to AVA of \$30 for a traditional day event, \$40 for a Year Round and \$35 for a Seasonal walking event that runs for three quarters. Of the \$3.00 fee for credit, \$1.75 remains with the club and a \$1.25 participation fee goes to AVA. This means that we need 30 to 35 participants paying \$3.00 to simply cover the sanction fees. Additional event costs include producing the YRE/SE brochure, directions, and start cards.

Following are participation totals for the last three years. Granted, 2020 numbers were greatly impacted by COVID-19-related mandates starting in March of that year, whereas 2021 numbers showed improvement.

It takes many volunteer hours to make these events happen, and by participating you can show that the time spent was worthwhile. Let's get walking so the numbers trend up again for 2022!

Sunday, April 3 - Boston Special Places - Last year we had 22 participants at this event. Here's your opportunity to walk it again or do it for the first time. For example, how many people know that just a few blocks from the start at the Prudential Building and all the bustle of downtown is a lovely, peaceful walking and biking trail along the Charles River? All 5K and 11K participants enjoy this first 3/4 miles (1.2K) of the walk on the Esplanade where one can experience much natural beauty, especially in early spring!
