

In Memoriam: Barbara Kimball

October 3, 1927-April 22, 2022



I first met Barbara Kimball in late 1990s when she regularly showed up at volkswalks with her 80ish-yearold friend Betty Butterworth. Years later, I often drove Barbara to events and enjoyed listening to stories

of how, growing up in Wellesley, her mother didn't allow her to learn to drive a car because it was too dangerous—so Barbara learned to fly a plane! She was always adventurous and enjoyed the outdoors, regularly walking in her Hopkinton neighborhood with her son Wayne and in Stony Brook Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary, where she also volunteered. She also had fond memories of camping with her husband and sons in Baxter State Park in Maine, which is where she asked her son Cliff to take her for her 80th birthday.

Barbara continued volkswalking and helping to staff events until recently when health challenges intervened. Still game for short walks, Barbara joined my granddaughter Priya and me last November on Hopkinton's Center Trail. Walk 'n Mass sends heartfelt condolences to Barbara's family.


