# President's Corner

Did you see the brochure for Lincoln Woods? Many thanks to Monica and Bea Hait for putting it all together. I'm so excited for everyone to come! It's a beautiful walk. I know the preregistration requirement is a little unusual; it does take a little of the spontaneity out of it. If you want to come but aren't sure in advance, you can always use the new online start box (OSB) at my.ava.org up to the morning of the walk. It's really easy to use. You create an account and then you register and pay online by depositing a minimum of \$3 using a credit/ debit card. You can do that up until the morning of the walk. You'll pay \$2 upon registering and then when you go back in and mark that you did the walk, the additional \$1 is deducted from your OSB fund. The state park isn't allowing us to sell anything (including walk registration fee payments) and this is a good way to still let people decide that morning if they want to do the walk. If you use the OSB for registration, please check in at the onsite start table when you arrive so we know how many people are out on the trail. We will also have a patch you can pre-purchase. We did a walk in Lincoln Woods in 1993 and we have 20 patches left. There is a place on the registration form for you to indicate that you want one and it will be waiting for you when you check in.

# Charlotte Phillips Memorial Service by Beate Hait

A memorial service for Charlotte Phillips, former president and long-time member of Twin State Volkssport Association (TSVA), who died in December 2021 in San Antonio, TX, is tentatively scheduled for June 25.

The service will be held at 11:00 a.m. at the Cornwall Congregational Church, 2598 Rt. 30, Cornwall, VT and a luncheon will follow. (Her ashes will be buried at a later date in the Evergreen Cemetery on Rt. 74.)

We ask volkswalkers who would like to attend the service to wear a volkswalk-related t-shirt and meet at 10:45 a.m. in the parking lot of Bingham Memorial School, 112 School Rd. (off Rt. 30), to walk the short distance together to the service. The TSVA seasonal volkswalk in Middlebury, VT (8minute drive to Cornwall) is one that Charlotte planned—and has remained active to the present day. A group walk of that event will start at 8:45 a.m. from The Middlebury Inn, 14 Court Square, Middlebury, VT. Please register using Online Start Box (OSB) for full walk details. IVV Olympiad: Feb. 19-23, 2023 – Registration is open for the multi-day Olympiad in San Antonio at <u>ivvolympiad2023.org</u> and for reservations at the host hotel LaQuinta Riverwalk, which is where all of the walks will begin. AVA also negotiated with other hotel brands (e.g., Marriott, Hilton, and Red Roof Inn) to accommodate walkers' individual preferences. Early bird discount until Sept. 30.

[The location of an IVV Olympiad changes each year. My family attended the IVV Olympiad in Seefeld, Austria in 2001. What fun to enjoy the scenery along the routes with thousands of international participants! I encourage you to consider joining in the fun.]

IML San Antonio: Feb. 24-26, 2023 –The IVV Olympiad in San Antonio is piggy-backed with the International Marching Association (IML) festival that draws thousands of international walkers. Normally, there is only one authorized IML event per member country, but a second can be authorized if it is held a sufficient distance from the first and in a different topography. In the US, two IML events are held annually: US Freedom Walk Festival in October in Arlington, VA and the Texas Trail Roundup in February in San Antonio, TX.

Another reason to travel to San Antonio in February: the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo is in town!
