Year Round and Seasonal Events – Though we're only half way through the year, this is the time we need to decide which YREs and SEs to renew for 2023. If we use participation numbers as the sole determining factor, we would renew very few. Of the 18 walks and 2 bikes, many had annual participation totals fewer than 25: 7 events in 2021; 13 events in 2020 and 2 events in 2019 fit that description. Annual participation totals of all events combined show 898 in 2021; 601 in 2020 and 1,252 in 2019. As one would expect, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a great negative effect. Though pandemic restrictions have eased up, first quarter totals for this year were dismal. Second guarter ends in June. Stay tuned for a report of the 2022 two-quarter totals in the next newsletter.

Let's get these totals up this year! Routes are chosen for scenic beauty, historical interest, and other sights of note. Please make an effort to participate in some of our YREs and SEs: bike (Bedford and Sandwich/Bourne) and walk (Boston-Freedom Trail and Boston-Back Bay, Cheshire, Concord, Fall River, Hyannis, Lexington, Lowell, Newton, Plymouth, Provincetown, Quincy, Sandwich, Shelburne Falls and Wellesley, Massachusetts as well as Bristol, Newport and Providence, Rhode Island). Start Point info is on our website, in the brochure that was mailed to members last December, and on ava.org.

If you'd like company when you walk, please note the many group walks that are scheduled. Recently, the average attendance at a group walk has been in the 4 to 8 range. We'd like to see that number go up, too! If you prefer not to walk with others, use that date as a goal to get out and participate in any of our YREs or SEs.
