When I took on the job of Publicity for the club I was given a binder with all the contacts to newspapers the previous publicity volunteer used to post our events. Going through it I found a lot of the contacts had either changed or the papers had been taken over by a bigger company or had gone out of business. I have since been updating sources for publicizing our events.

I was a paper girl delivering the Worcester Evening Gazette for 3 years, and when I moved to Marlborough as an adult I had the MetroWest newspaper delivered to me daily until the newspaper was often thrown on my driveway instead of being placed in the box. When it snowed, my plow guy plowed the newspaper under and I never saw it until the spring thaw. I then switched to an E-edition, which was the same subscription price I was already paying for physical paper. The problem was I didn't go online to read the paper every day. After cancelling the e-subscription, every so often I now go to my local grocery store and pick up the Sunday paper. I prefer to flip pages, cut out recipes, and rip out the local event page for events I am interested in attending. The physical newspaper is also useful to wash windows, line my floor when painting, and for composting in my garden. But I realize that newspaper delivery is now becoming obsolete.

Lately, I have been posting our events to free websites connected to newspapers/E-editions still in existence, town/city website calendars

that I do not have to subscribe to, and my local Patch website. I also drop off brochures to my local YMCA, library, and Senior Center. However, the latter three sources only let me drop off brochures if the event is local to my town and the surrounding towns. Previously, I could get our events posted to the Marlborough Cable TV, but that has changed recently too. Bea Hait has shared a few email/web contacts to use in the Holliston area. Our events are posted by Blake Mitchel to the club Facebook and Meetup pages, and Bill Howe updates our website (walknmass.org).

To make new people aware of volkssporting and attract them to our events, I believe we need good old footwork to drop off brochures or club flyers. I cannot travel all over the state of MA or RI to libraries or fitness facilities, grocery stores, coffee shops, Senior Centers, etc. to drop off brochures of our events so I need your assistance. A volkssporter or the POC in the event area knows the local options better than I. If you have ideas for any physical flyer or brochure distributions, please let me know!


